Did you know there are about 92,000 registered Democrats in Lincoln? That may sound like a lot—until you realize there are also about 121,000 registered Republicans. So yes, Democrats are outnumbered.

Because we are outnumbered in Lincoln, ***every Democrat's vote really matters.*** That's why the **Neighbor-to-Neighbor (N2N)** program was created and is now used in many communities across the nation. It works—neighborhoods with N2N program see voter turnout go up by 20 to 30 points.

What is the Neighbor 2 Neighbor Program?

In the N2N program, a volunteer **Neighborhood Leader** takes on one of the most basic roles in democracy: keeping Democratic neighbors informed about meetings, candidates, and other updates. This month, the focus is simple—reminding your neighbors to vote.

How does it work?

We'll give you a list of Democrats on your street, and you can decide how many to contact. We suggest a minimum of 10, to a maximum of 35 neighbors.

Once you've made that initial face-to-face connection, you can stay in touch monthly through other forms of communication—email, phone

calls, or even a house party. Each month, we'll provide a handout you can share with them.

How often will I have to contact my neighbors?

Once a month for the next six months, leading up to the midterm elections. The program will then be evaluated for possible refinements ahead of the 2028 election cycle.
